

Half Million Pounds of Litter Picked Up

In July 2006 CJS began the Litter Control Program. Over the past 9 years, offenders have picked up over half a million pounds of litter off of 9,881 miles of Culpeper roadways.

The Board of Supervisors should be applauded for supporting such an efficient program that brings benefit to every citizen of Culpeper.

Since 2006: 504,240 pounds of trash

Culpeper County Criminal Justice Services (CJS) provides local probation supervision to misdemeanor and non-violent felons.

The mission of the Culpeper County Criminal Justice Services Program is to increase public safety by providing probation services and sanctions that hold offenders accountable for their actions and reduce the risk of recidivism.





Risk Level Data




The above graph indicates the risk level of offenders that were placed with CJS and their cases were closed in FY15. As the graph indicates, more than one half of offenders under supervision with CJS were assessed to be low risk to reoffend.



The above graph indicates offender success rate based on their risk level. The risk level is determined utilizing validated assessment tools called the MOST (Modified Offender Screening Tool) and the OST (Offender Screening Tool).

The above graph shows the reason for unsuccessful closure separated by risk level. The vast majority of unsuccessful closures were technical violations (violation of probation terms and/or conditions).

Evidence Based Practices

CJS began the implementation of evidence-based practices (EBP) in FY2011. CJS utilizes risk assessment tools (MOST & OST), motivational interviewing, case planning, and operates an in-house cognitive behavioral program (Moral Reconciliation Therapy). EBP "is the application of science into operational practice for services and programs for offenders. The goal in Virginia is to use practices that have been empirically tested and have been shown to reduce recidivism among offenders. Based on numerous studies and Meta analyses of offender rehabilitation programs, researchers have outlined a set of principles to guide the implementation of EBP."
